

## Broome Learning Network Centre



- 1991 established by the Department of Employment, Education & Training (DEET)
- One of three trial centres in the Kimberley – Broome, Derby and Kununurra
- A focus on improving access to post compulsory education



### Broome WA Link



- 1994 officially incorporated as Broome WA Link
- Two public access computers running DOS
- A focus on community use as a technology hub and a wide range of government and community services



Broome WA Link



- 1993 WA Telecentre Network formed
- Established by Department of Employment, Vocational Education & Training (DEVET)
- Expanded to 18 centres across WA Broome being Telecentre No. 1



Broome Telecentre



- Telecentre Network expanded to 38 centres
- Services included hosting Westlink, the former free to air satellite TV, talkback & videoconferencing station for regional and remote WA



Broome Telecentre




- 1996 Broome WA Link formally renamed Broome Telecentre
- Network further expanded to 76 centres under the Department of Commerce & Trade (Regional Development Division)

Resource Centre

- 2009 Telecentres rebranded to Community Resource Centres
- 2010 Broome Telecentre formally renamed Broome Community Resource Centre



Broome Community
Resource Centre

- Funding support moved to Royalties for Regions
- Network expanded to a peak of 110 centres
