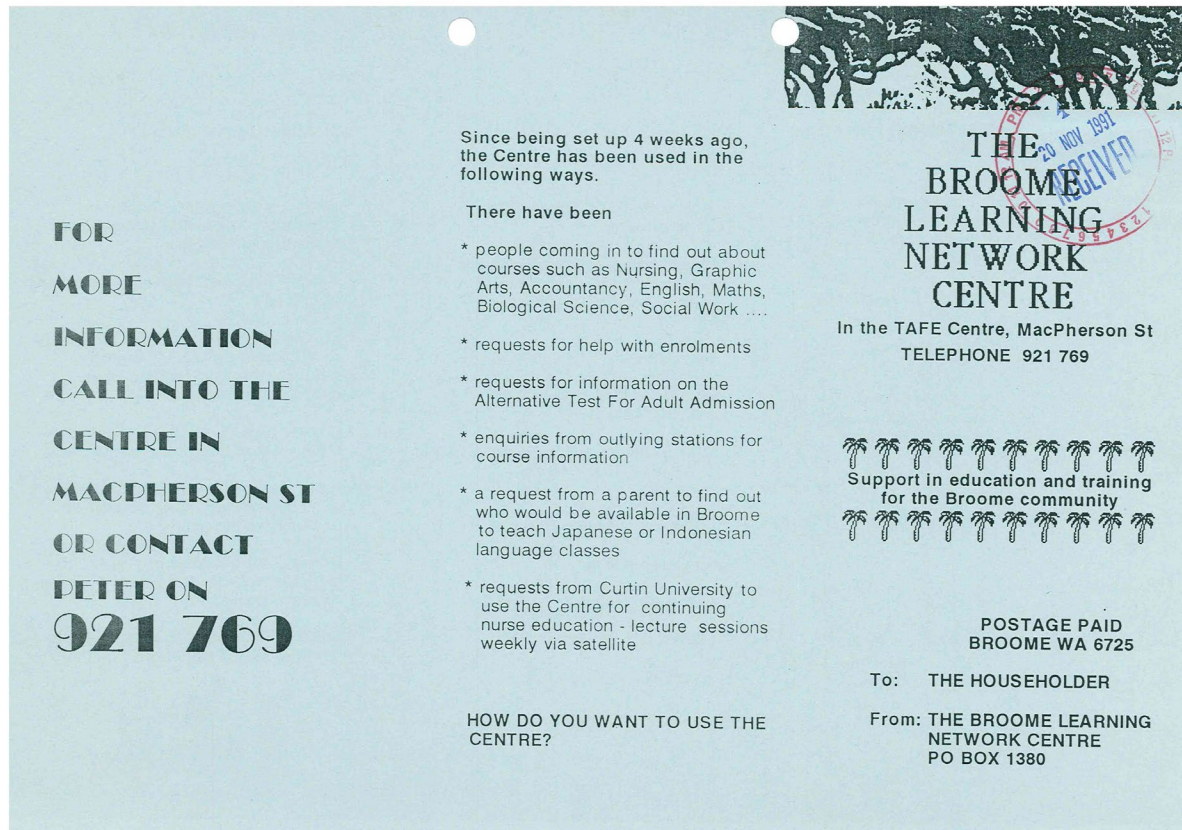

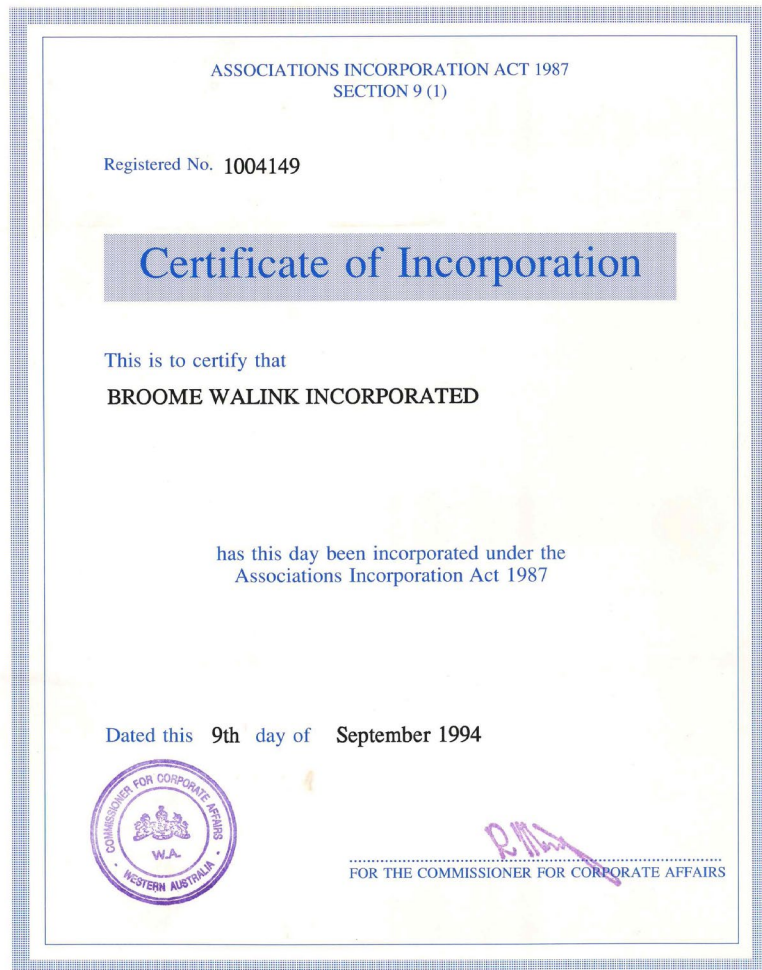
Broome Learning Network Centre



- 1991 – established by the Department of Employment, Education & Training (DEET)
- One of three trial centres in the Kimberley – Broome, Derby and Kununurra
- A focus on improving access to post compulsory education

WA Link



- 1994 – officially incorporated as Broome WA Link
- Two public access computers running DOS
- A focus on community use as a technology hub and a wide range of government and community services

- 1993 – WA Telecentre Network formed
- Established by Department of Employment, Vocational Education & Training (DEVET)
- Expanded to 18 centres across WA – Broome being Telecentre No. 1

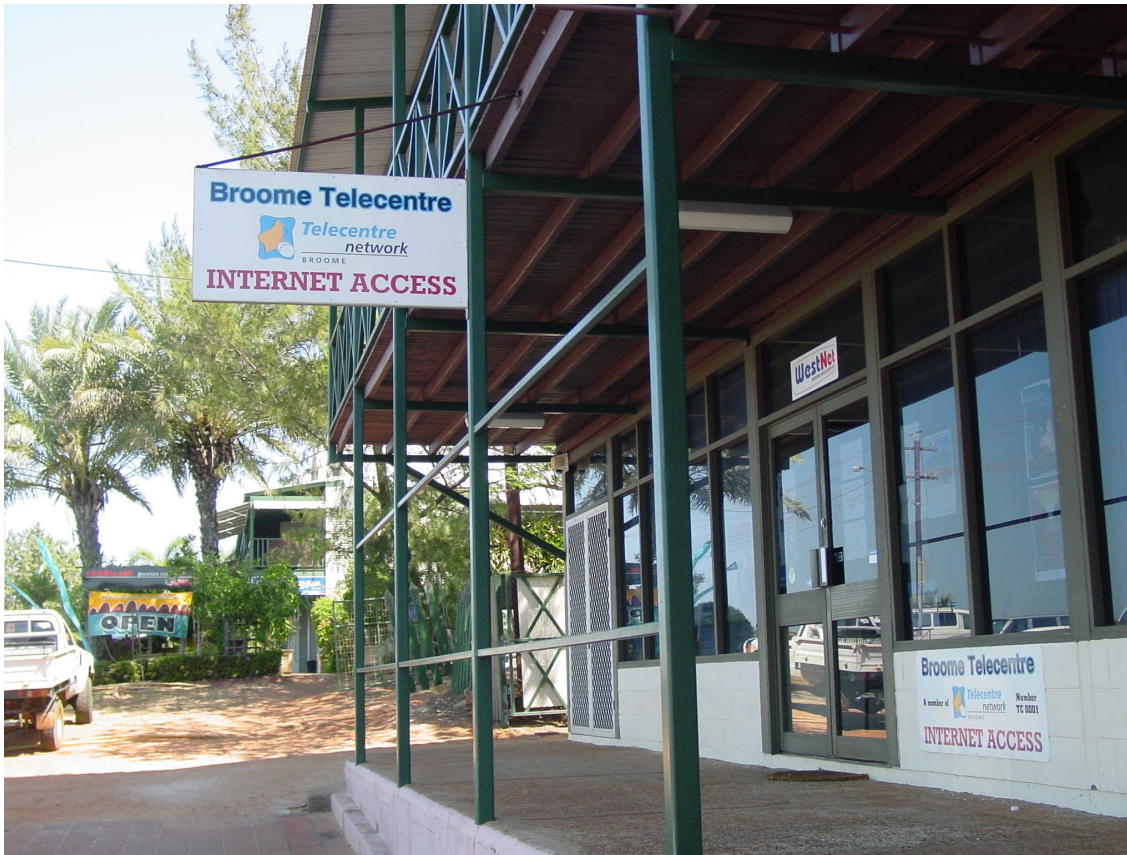

- Telecentre Network expanded to 38 centres
- Services included hosting Westlink, the former free to air satellite TV, talkback & videoconferencing station for regional and remote WA

- 1996 – Broome WA Link formally renamed Broome Telecentre
- Network further expanded to 76 centres under the Department of Commerce & Trade (Regional Development Division)

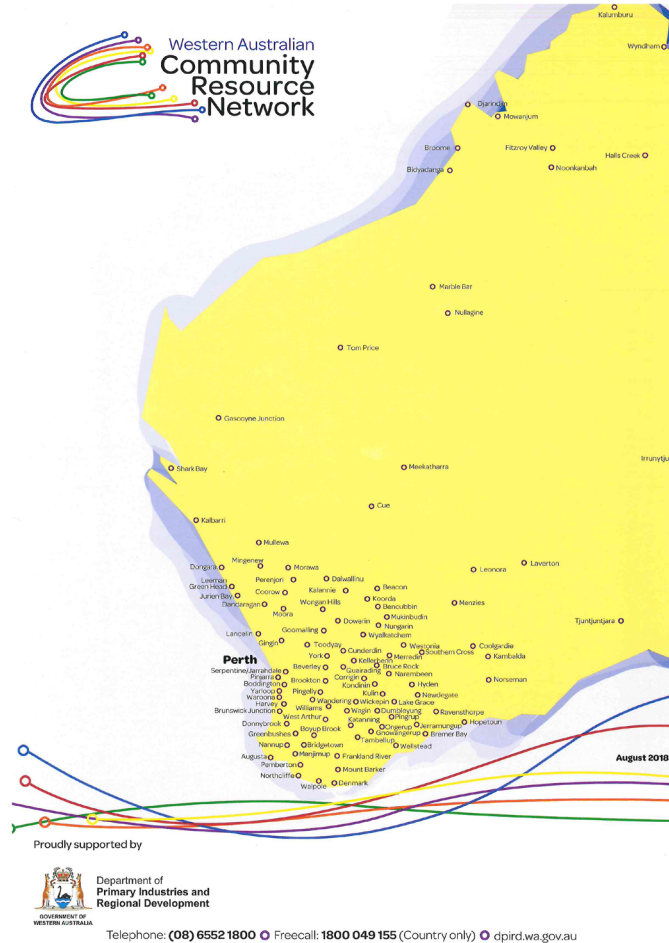


Broome Community

- 2009 – Telecentres rebranded to Community Resource Centres
- 2010 – Broome Telecentre formally renamed Broome Community Resource Centre
